Wilbur and Orville Wright

In 1783, the first successful balloon flight took place in France.

Harriet Quimby

In 1927, the pilot of the *Spirit of St. Louis* was the first person to fly nonstop across the Atlantic Ocean.

Charles Lindbergh

In Kitty Hawk, North Carolina in December 1903, the first successful airplane flight took place.

Etienne and Joseph Montgolfier

The first solo flight across the Atlantic Ocean by a woman occurred in 1932.

The Granville Brothers

In 1911, this person became the first licensed female pilot in the United States.

James Doolittle

In the late 1920s and 1930s, Gee Bee airplanes were built by these people in Springfield, Massachusetts.

Amelia Earhart

In 1900, the first metal-framed airship took flight over Germany.

Count Ferdinand von Zeppelin

In 1922, this pilot completed the first transcontinental flight across the United States.
